

#### So What?!

Will Jesus make any difference during this upcoming political season? Will Jesus change how we relate to each other or how we build relationships across the aisle? How will we embody the gospel in our service, our community, and even in our voting? Does Jesus make a difference in the way our society treats those who are poor or are displaced from their homes or nations?

Christians talk about salvation frequently, but that is only one outcome of Jesus' life and ministry. What difference does Jesus make to you?

Paul's letter to Philemon never mentions salvation, but this tiny letter contains so many outcomes of the gospel that readers can be overwhelmed by the enormity of changes Jesus makes to individuals, relationships, the world, the church, and, in fact, every area of life.

Our fall sermon series will explore how Jesus truly impacts absolutely everything in life. When Paul writes to his friend Philemon, many great implications of the gospel are revealed. These implications not only prepare us to be faithful during a polarizing political season, but also teach us what active faith can look like every day and in every way.

### Discussions on Christian Nationalism and U. S. Christianity

What is Christian nationalism? What accounts for its strong appeal in Christian communities across the U.S.? And how should faith relate to national identity and social responsibility? This four-week course explores the history of modern Christian nationalism, its stubborn presence in the U.S. (including the Inland Northwest), and the ways it shapes and misshapes understandings of Christian identity today.

Led by Dr. Kevin Vander Schel, an Associate Professor in Religious Studies at Gonzaga University, course discussions will trace the origins of modern Christian nationalism, and will consider examples of Christian nationalism in the U.S. and abroad, the mainstream acceptance of nationalism in American Christianity, and the ongoing challenge of nationalist thinking in Christian communities. Optional electronic readings will be provided. Classes held on Sundays at 10:30 AM in the Skylight Room, 9/15, 9/22, 9/29, and 10/13.

### Wednesday AM Bible Study

Jesus' core teaching comes to us in the form of parables. When we encounter a parable in the gospels, we're tempted to assign it a singular meaning. Biblical scholar Amy-Jill Levine instead encourages us to explore what parables "do" in our lives, rather than what they "mean." This fall, we'll engage with Dr. Levine's work as we study six parables from the teachings of Jesus. Join us Wednesday mornings at 9:30 in the Skylight Room. #### Two Grief Group Experiences Starting Soon

Losing a loved one is one of the hardest things we have to endure. We grieve not only the loss of our special person, but we can also grieve other losses that come as a result of their absence like a change of identity (from spouse to widow, child to orphan...we don't even have a word for a parent who has lost a child or for someone who has lost a sibling). We can grieve a loss of freedom if our person was the driver and now we are more confined to our home, a loss of home if we need to move, a loss of financial security, and even a change in how we are treated by our friend groups.

Grief is normal and necessary but can feel overwhelming and messy. Sometimes we think that we are doing it wrong or that no one could possibly understand what we are going through. Talking about our personal experiences in a group helps us to realize that we aren't crazy. Learning that other people have similar emotions and experiences while dealing with grief can bring us back into community and can help us feel not quite so lonely.

Kids need at least five separate adults (outside of their parents) investing in them and caring for them to be best set up to succeed. You could be a part of caring for the next generation at Hamblen through these ways:

- **Sunday School Teacher:** Guide the kids (either PreK-1st or 2nd-5th) through predetermined Sunday School curriculum, which might include teaching, fun games and activities, and/or a video. This can be once a month, twice a month, or every week!
- Journey Meal Team: Cook and serve weekly meals on Wednesdays. Rotation-based, monthly or bi-monthly.
- Sunday School Helper or Journey Helper (open to youth as well): Assist in our weekly ministries corralling and guiding the kids, helping the leaders and teachers, and investing relationally in the children.
